Boston, Mass., [September 10, 2024] –While we mourn the hundreds of thousands of Palestinian lives lost and millions displaced during the continued Israeli assault on Gaza, we believe that it is vital for our community to hear Palestinian voices and find a space to gather in these trying times. The Boston Palestine Film Festival (BPFF) will return for the 18th season this year with a selection of the best films by and about Palestinians. Screening at multiple locations across Boston, including the MFA, MassArt, Regent Theatre, and the Coolidge Corner Theater, this year's festival will take place from October 18 to 27. Our opening film **The Teacher** will screen at the MFA with a recorded introduction by the Oscar-nominated, Bafta-winning, British-Palestinian director **Farah Nabulsi**. The BPFF will close at the Coolidge Corner Theater with **To a Land Unknown**, directed by Mahdi Fleifel and starring Mahmood Bakri. This year's program will also include multiple premiers including the world premiere of **Mawtini (My Homeland)** and the North America premier of the **Deer's Tooth**.

Our opening film, **The Teacher** tells the story of Basem a Palestinian schoolteacher (Saleh Bakri) who struggles to hide his risky political involvement from his student mentee (Muhammed Abed El Rahman) and his British girlfriend (Imogen Poots). Fatal Israeli settler violence, the destruction of Palestinian homes by Israeli edict, and a hostage operation set in 2014 make this film a very topical artistic production. **The Teacher**, Farah Nabulsi's feature directorial debut, has been well-received by national and global audiences. It has earned multiple awards, including Best International Film at the Galway Film Fleadh and the Audience Award at the Washington DC Filmfest. Our closing film **To a Land Unknown** follows the journey of Chatila (Mahmoud Bakri) a Palestinian refugee living on the fringes of society in Athens who gets ripped off by a smuggler and sets out to seek revenge.

In addition to these two award-winning films, the BPFF is looking forward to sharing with our local audiences a wide range of documentaries, such as **Bye Bye Tiberias** by Lina Soualem, which follows actress Hiam Abbass's return home with her daughter, the film director, in an intimate documentary about four generations of women and their shared legacy of separation (10/20 at the MFA). Our shorts program this year will also screen at the MFA on 10/20 and will feature such titles as **Mar Mama** (Boston Premiere), **The Deer's Tooth** (North America premiere), **Palestine Islands**, and **An Orange from Jaffa**. Two of the BPFF's documentary films will screen at MassArt on 10/21; **Three Promises** by Yusuf Sruji and the experimental film **Familiar Phantoms** by Larissa Sansour and Søren Lind. In her early twenties, Hiam Abbass left her native Palestinian village to follow her dream of becoming an actress in Europe, leaving behind her mother, grandmother, and seven sisters. Thirty years later, her filmmaker daughter Lina returns with her to the village and questions for the first time her mother's bold choices, her chosen exile and the way the women in their family influenced both their lives.

Featured Film: *No Other Land* (Basel Adra, Hamdan Ballal, Yuval Abraham & Rachel Szor), Documentary, 2024

Basel Adra, a young Palestinian activist from Masafer Yatta, has been fighting his community's mass expulsion by the Israeli occupation since childhood. Basel documents the gradual erasure of Masafer Yatta, as soldiers destroy the homes of families -the largest single act of forced transfer ever carried out in the occupied West Bank. He crosses paths with Yuval, an Israeli journalist who joins his struggle, and for over half a decade they fight against the expulsion while growing closer.

But when Reda loses their hard-earned cash to his dangerous drug addiction, Chatila hatches an extreme plan, which involves them posing as smugglers and taking hostages in an effort to get him and his best friend out of their hopeless environment before it is too late.

Since 2007, the Boston Palestine Film Festival has been introducing Palestine-related cinema, narratives, and culture to New England audiences and beyond. The festival has featured over 500 compelling and thought-provoking films, including documentaries, dramatic features, animated films, rare early works, video art pieces, and new films by emerging artists and youth. These works from directors around the world have offered refreshingly honest, self-described, and independent views of Palestine and its history, culture, and geographically dispersed society. The festival News page features original interviews with filmmakers and related content.

The festival has also presented other events throughout the years, including concerts, exhibits, film screenings, live storytelling events in partnership with Palestinians Podcast (2015-2020), and Arab Film Week.

The BPFF Executive Committee works year-round on an all-volunteer basis to sustain the festival.
